Marriage as a Mission Partnership

Christian marriage is a committed partnership between a believing man & woman. A successful "Christian" marriage requires that both partners fully commit themselves to spiritual growth and fulfillment of God's design.

(Genesis 2:24) For this cause a man shall leave his father and his mother, and shall cleave to his wife; and they shall become one flesh.

- § Two you will always be separate individuals as unto the Lord
- § One partnership two working in union to accomplish God's mission
- **§** Become **hayah** qal pf partnership is developed not automatic

(1 Peter 3:7) You husbands likewise, live with your wives in an understanding way, as with a weaker vessel, since she is a woman; and grant her honor as a fellow heir of the grace of life, so that your prayers may not be hindered.

- § Joint heirs sunkleronomos equal inheritors of God's grace
- **§** Honor **time** consider valuable equal in value equal partners
- § Emphasis is the mutual valuing & equal importance of partner

(2 Cor 6:1) working together with Him, we also urge you not to receive the grace of God in vain

- **§** Working together **sunergeo** fellow workers in Christ
- § H/W are fellow worker with Christ in the ministry through marriage

Emphasizes mutual responsibility of making marriage a ministry to others. (2 Cor 6:14) "Do not be bound together with unbelievers; for what partnership have righteousness and lawlessness, or what fellowship has light with darkness?"

- **§** Unequally yoked married, partners in business, etc
- **§** Partners **metoche** business partners Herodotus, Euripides
- **§** Fellowship **koinonia koinos** to share in common joint stockholders
- **§** H/W are partners in the business of marriage and both hold stock
- § Fellowship emphasizes the mutual sharing of spiritual life in marriage
 - Vs 15 Harmony sumphonesis symphony sing together in harmony
 - Vs 16 Agreement sunkatathesis vote the same; mutual consent

General Principles

1. All believer's, both men and women are equal in Christ

- **§** Koinos all have an equal share of grace assets GHS, WG, prayer
- **§** Sunkleronomos equal opportunity for inheritance growth/ministry/rewards
- § Sunergeo equal servants equal responsibility to serve God in marriage
- **§ Dikaiosune** justified equal in +R standing before God
- § Equally valuable to God love, grace, mercy, power, opportunity
- **§** Sumphonesis working together in harmony
- **§** Sunkatathesis working together by mutual agreement

2. God has designed different roles for Christian men/women in marriage.

Ex: Godhead – GF-GS-GHS are all co-equal & co-eternal – different roles in the plan GF – Plans/Head; GS – Executes; GHS – Reveals Phil 2:6-8 – Christ existing as God, humbled himself to the point of death on a cross

§ Eph 5:23 – husband is head (authority) over wife as Christ is head of the church

§ Eph 5:24 – as church is submissive to Christ, so wives to husbands in everything Husband/wife are equal partners in Christ with different roles in marriage.

Partnership

1. Partnership is a position, a point of view and a practice.

Position – equal partners in the business of marriage

Point of View – Mind-set - we are in this together, we are partners in this journey

- **§** Belief system what you believe marriage should be, could be
- **§** Expectations what you expect of yourself & your partner

Practice – fully participate in those activities that are agreed upon

- **§** Acceptance accept your partner w/out trying to change them
- **§** Change change yourself to be a good partner become the right person
- **§** Action do that which will promote partnership in marriage

2. Point of View – how you see your partner and the relationship

Belief System (faith) - orderly arrangement of beliefs into a viewpoint

§ Believe biblical principles – God says you are equal partners in the marriage
§ Believe that God's plan is advantageous – God knows how marriage should work
§ Believe that partnership is possible – overcome hindrances – mental sins

Expectations (hope) – What is realistic to expect from your partner

§ Understand your partner's personality, background/baggage, beliefs
§ Partnership develops over time if both partners decide to pursue it
§ Eliminate unrealistic/idealistic expectations – we are sinners saved by Grace
§ Do not expect that your efforts to change your partner will work – manipulation

3. Practice – what you decide and <u>do</u> to develop partnership

<u>Acceptance</u> – allowing your partner to be himself or herself

§ Your partner comes to the marriage with strengths & weaknesses
§ They must work on themselves through spiritual growth – change self
§ You cannot change another person – you can only change yourself

<u>Change</u> – working on yourself

§ Spiritual growth is a renewing of our beliefs, expectations and relating skills

§ Only you can decide to change by using God's grace assets

Action – where the rubber meets the road

§ Committing time, thought, energy, effort into the daily activities of your home
§ Sacrificing your own interests in order to fulfill those responsibilities
§ Doing partnership – be responsible to do daily activities together

4. Partnership requires discussion & agreement about mutual activities.

§ Partnership does not preclude individuality, preferences or alone time/activities
§ One partner should not dominate the planning or the preferences – compromise
§ Partnership requires that each consider the preferences of the other – feelings

5. Partnership begins with daily duties and develops into a partnership of the heart

§ Daily duties of work, house cleaning, children, church, finances, etc.
§ Partners help each other grow in their relationship with the Lord – encouragement
§ As trust develops based on considerate treatment, hearts can merge together.

6. Hindrances to developing partnership.

§ Egocentrism – belief that your view and preferences are the right/only ones

- § Old man hurts/pain in core of the heart defenses avoid/withdraw/confront/rigidity
- **§** Over emphasis of biblical roles take care of your job & I will take care of mine; over/misuse of authority; refusal to accept submissive role
- § Misdirected priorities excessive pursuit of money, ministry, social life, pleasure
