The Mystery of Gospel Ambassadorship (07)

We are currently studying a series entitled, Mystery Doctrines.

Today we will study the fifth Mystery Doctrine, Mystery Gospel Ambassadorship taken from Eph.6:18-20.

We will begin by examining our lesson text by five points.

•	Praying	(Eph.6:18a)	"Pray at all times in Spirit, and with this in view,"
•	Persevering	(Eph.6:18b)	"Be on the alert with all perseverance and petition for all the saints,"
•	Proclaiming make	(Eph.6:19)	"That utterance may be given to me in the opening of my mouth, to
	Шакс		known with boldness the mystery of the gospel."
•	Prison	(Eph.6:20a)	"For which I am an ambassador in chains;
•	Predilection	(Eph.6:20b)	"That in proclaiming it I may speak boldly, as I ought to speak."

This lesson will study four aspects of the doctrine of the Mystery of Gospel Ambassadorship.

1. The gospel was not the mystery, but every Church Age Believer (CAB) becoming an ambassador of the gospel to the world was the mystery (Eph.6:18-20; Gal.3:8, 14, 26-29).

(2 Cor.5:18-21) "**Now all these things are from God**, who reconciled us to Himself, through Christ, and gave us the ministry of reconciliation, **namely**, that God was in Christ reconciling the world to Himself, not counting their trespasses against them, and He has committed to us the word of reconciliation. **Therefore** we are **ambassadors for Christ**, as though God were entreating through us; we beg you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God. He made Him who knew no sin to be sin on our behalf, that we might become the righteousness of God in Him." (2 Cor.5:1-21) [**therefore**] (2 Cor.5:6, 9, 11, 16, 17, 20) (Rom.16:25-27; Col.4:3-4)

2. While every Church Age Believer (CAB) is an Ambassador of the Ministry of Reconciliation on the basis of Positional Sanctification (2 Thess.2:13-14) 1 of 20 status privileges.

An ambassador (presbeutes) is a CAB who represents the gospel of Jesus Christ to the world.

(1 Cor.15:3-4; Rom.1:16; Eph.2:8-9). "For He delivered us from the domain of darkness, and transferred us to the kingdom of His beloved Son, in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins." (Col.1:13-14; Acts 26:18)

(Gal.2:16) "Therefore **if** [1cc / and it's true] man is in Christ, he is a new creature; the old things passed away; (Phil.3:5-9); behold, new things have come." (2 Cor.5:17) [50 THINGS FREE] (Acts 15:1, 11)

3. Paul taught that there were three mental attitudes that were important to the effectiveness of the service of ambassadorship of the gospel of Christ in Rom.1:14-16 (note the eight "to").

(Rom.1:14) "I am under obligation (opheiletes [debtor] to whom?) both to the Greeks and to barbarians, both to the wise and to the foolish."

(Rom.1:15) "Thus, for my part, <u>I am eager (prothumos) [ready]</u> for what?) to preach the gospel to you also who are in Rome."

(Rom.1:16) <u>"For I am not ashamed (ouk epaischunomai / p.m.ind.1ps) [why?] of the gospel</u>, for it is the power of God for salvation **to** everyone who believes, **to** the Jew first and also **to** the Greek."

Therefore, it is the ambassador's gospel message that the world must believe in order to be reconciled to God (John 14:6; 1 Cor.15:3-4; Rom.1:16; Eph.2:8-9; 2 Cor.2:14-17).

The significance of the ambassador is the **gospel message not the gospel messenger** (1 Cor.1:12-13); (1 Thess.1:4-5).

4. The ambassador of the gospel of Christ will often suffer and be persecuted for delivering the message (Phil.1:29; Matt.21:33-46) [Parable of tenants / servants and Son) (2 Cor.11:22-28).

(Phil.1:7) "For it is only right for me to feel this way about you all, because I have you in my heart, since both in my imprisonment and in the defense and confirmation of the gospel, you all are partakers of grace with me.", (Phil.112-14, 27)

The enemy of the gospel message is not the human opposition per se but the cowardly enemy who hide behind it in the angelic conflict (Matt.16:21-23; Eph.6:12; 2 Cor.4:3-4; 1 John 3:8, 12; 4:4).

(Matt.7:15-16a) "Beware of the false prophets, who come to you in sheep's clothing, but inwardly are ravenous wolves. You will know them by their fruit.
