BEFORE THEY CAME TOGETHER

In out last 2018 Christmas lesson, we mentioned the **conjunction** (**de**) used in Matt.1:18-25 to interject new material into the fulfillment of the birth of Christ out of messianic genealogy (Matt.1:1-17).

We used the conjunction (<u>de) to develop a six-part outline</u> of (Matt.1:18-25) and referred to this as a Greek marker of a passage to be studied.

- (Matt.1:18) Spiritual pregnancy of Mary
- (Matt.1:19) Spiritual problem to Joseph
- (Matt.1:20) Spiritual Promise to Joseph of his marriage to Mary
- (Matt.1:21) Spiritual Promise to Joseph of the Son and Savior
- (Matt.1:22-23) Spiritual Prophesy of (Isa.7:14) of the Immanuel Child
- (Matt.1:24-25) Spiritual Performance of Joseph (arose, did, took, kept, and called)

This lesson will study three aspects of "Before They Came Together."

- 1. We will begin by separating the second sentence of (Matt.1:18) into three parts for examination.
 - Promised "When His mother Mary had been betrothed (mnesteuo/ a.p.ptc.gsf) to Joseph,
 - **Pre-marital high drama "before (**prin/ adverb + e/ disjunctive conjunction + a.infin) **they** (**autos**) (a.pl.m of general reference of betrothed) **came together (sunerchomai/** <u>a.infin/ fact/</u> verbal noun of doctrine abstinence of pre-marital sex),
 - **Pregnant** "she was found (heurisko/ a.p.ind 3ps/ Main Verb) to be (echo/ p.a.ptc nsf/ verbal adjective) with child (en+loc of sphere/ womb (gaster/ lsf/ pregnant) by (ek+abl. of source) Holy Spirit (Hagios Pneuma/ abl.sn/ no def. article/ creative work)." (Matt.1:18b)
 - The main verb ("found") is important to the two participles (betrothed) and (pregnant). Matthew separated them by our lesson title "**Before They** Came Together."

2. Despite over-whelming judgmental criticism regarding her pregnancy, they chose to walk by faith and not by sight.

(Matt.1:24-25) "And Joseph **arose** from his sleep, and **did as** the angel of Lord commanded him, and **took her as his wife;** and <u>kept her a virgin until she gave birth</u> to a Son; **and he called His name Jesus**."

They chose to remain celibate while courting and during engagement and even after virgin pregnancy (2 Cor.5:7; Col.2:6-7).

They chose to walk by faith before marriage to prepared themselves for marriage and family and life itself. They chose to even go a step further in their walk by faith to abstain "until she gave birth to the Son of God."

They chose to have a house full of children (Matt.13:55-56).

They chose to walk by faith despite others not accepting the truth regarding Mary's first pregnancy as something even beyond miraculous – virgin conception by Holy Spirit.

The devil used legalistic religion to throw it in the face of Jesus amid great ministry.

(John 8:41) "They said to Him, 'We were not born of fornication; we have one father.""

Jesus identified legalistic religion's spiritual problem:

(John 8:15) "You judge according to the flesh; I am not judging anyone."

(John 8:47) "<u>He who is of God hears the words of God</u>; for this reason, you do not hear them, because you are not of God." (John 14:6)

3. A four-point "Biblical Test" for Christians who are courting, thinking about marriage.

- First test:
 - Is a believer to marry an unbeliever? (1 Cor.7:39; 9:5; 2 Cor.6:14-16).
