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PT: Ron Adema Study: The Faith Cycle

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## THE SELF-EVIDENT TRUTH OF THE FAITH CYCLE

In our last study we learned that the writer of Hebrews grouped certain Old Covenant believers listed in (Heb.11:4-40) into four groups.

•	Group 1	Antediluvian period	(Heb.11:4-7)
•	Group 2	Patriarch period	(Heb.11:8-22)
•	Group 3	Jewish period	(Heb.11:23-38)
•	Group 4	Church age period	(Heb.11:39-40)

We also learned that the writer gave a specific doctrinal principle in each grouping regarding the Faith Cycle.

•	Group 1	(Heb.11:6)	
•	Group 2	(Heb.11:13-16)	
•	Group 3	(Heb.11:38)	
•	Group 4	(Heb.11:39-40)	

We will study these specific doctrinal principles of Faith Cycle from each of the four groupings.

<u>Four aspects</u> of doctrinal principle entitled, Self-Evident Truth of Faith Cycle taken from the Antediluvian period.

1. The writer picked three out of ten spiritually mature believers to present the importance of consistency of applying the faith cycle (Abel, Enoch and Noah) (Heb.11:4-7).

The first believer introduced was **Abel** not Seth. This is a clue that the emphasis is not on the genealogy of the messianic seed; but rather on the mechanics of the faith cycle even unto death [martyr] (1 John 3:12).

Hearing (Rom.10:17)

Completing (Jas.2:22)

Believing (Heb.4:2)

Applying (2 Cor.5:7

2. Note where the writer placed doctrinal principle of the faith cycle. He placed it between Enoch and Noah (Heb.11:5- (6) -7).

Enoch (dedication) was the 7<sup>th</sup> in genealogy and Noah (rest) was the 10<sup>th</sup> (Gen.5).

The genealogy between Enoch and Noah was <u>Methuselah</u> (when he dies, it will be sent) [The oldest man/969] (2 Pet.3:9) and <u>Lamech</u> (strong, victor) (Rom.15:1; 2 Cor.12:9-10; Eph.2:8-10; 2 Tim.2:1-2; 1 John 5:4-5).

Here is what the writer placed between Enoch and Noah - "And without faith (it is) impossible to please (Him), for he who comes to God must believe that **He is** and (that) He is a rewarder of those who seek Him."

The Greek word for **without** is an unusual preposition, choris. Wuest introduced choris as an axiomatic truth or a <u>Self-Evident Truth of the Faith Cycle</u> - "without faith it is impossible to please God."

## 3. The Greek grammar helps us understand the doctrinal principle of the Self-evident Truth of the Faith Cycle stated in (Heb.11:6).

We will examine it in four parts.

- **1st** "To please" is an **aorist infinite** (absolute fact) subject working with the main verb ("He is/eimi") and with "impossible (adunatos)" as a predicate adjective of it.
  - o **Idea**: It is not impossible to please God if the faith cycle functions properly.
  - Now the writer gives <u>three additional points</u> regarding the Self-evident Truth of Faith Cycle.
- 2<sup>nd</sup> "For (gar/ explaining) he who comes (ton proserchomai/ present m.ptc.asm) to God must (dei/ p.m.impv 3ps) believe (pisteuo/ aorist infin/ second absolute fact).
- 3<sup>rd</sup> "That (hoti) He is (eimi/ p.a.ind.3ps) Essence of God backs the faith cycle (Rom.4:21).
- 4<sup>th</sup> "And (kai/ adjunctive conj.) **He is** (ginomai/ **p.**a.ind.3ps/ **becomes**) a rewarder of those who seek (ekzeteo/ **p.**a.ptc.dplm) Him." (completing of faith cycle/ Jas.2:22)
- 4. Enoch (dedicated to the faith cycle) and Noah (rest by means of faith cycle) (Gen.2:2; 5:29; Eph.2:8-10) were spiritually mature Old Covenant believers walking consistently by the faith cycle (Gen.5:22, 6:8).

They were spiritually mature believers who lived in the last days of the Antediluvian civilization (Gen.6-9) [Rainbow].

They were spiritually mature believers who preached the coming Divine Judgment upon the world

- [By Water] (Gen.6:5-9; Jude 14-15; 2 Pet.2:5) and (Luke 17:24-27; 2 Pet.3:5-9)
- [By Fire] (Matt.3:12)
