Lesson: FIRSTBORN OF ALL CREATION

Date: 8/5/25

Text: Col.1:15-16

We are currently studying four lessons taken from Col.1:9-20 which are divided by the Greek colon.

1:9-12 – God's Inheritance 1:13-14 – Rescued and Transferred into Freedom

1:15-16 - Firstborn of All Creation 1:17-20 - Firstborn of the Dead

Remember the **Greek colon** requires the student to **review** what was previous taught (1:13-14). One thing that should be brought into 1:15-16 is the title, **His Beloved Son**, to be applied to "**He** (hos/nsm relative pronoun)" in 1:15.

Col.1:15 introduces the **Theology Thesis of 1:9-20** as well as the Book with these words, "**He** (*His Beloved Son*) **is the image of the invisible God.**"

Today's lesson will study **FIVE** aspects of the **Firstborn of All Creation**.

1. Paul taught that Jesus Christ was the exact visible image (eikon) of the **invisible** (tou aoratos/ a=alpha privative and horao/ to see/ unseen) **God**.

"Now to the King eternal, **invisible**, the only God, be honor and glory forever and ever." (1 Tim. 1:17)

"For since the creation of the world His invisible attributes, His eternal power and divine nature, have been clearly seen, being understood through what has been made, so that they are without excuse." (Rom.1:20)

This was certainly true in the creation of Jesus Christ, His Beloved Son (*Luke1:30-35*/ immaculate conception by Holy Spirit/ Immanuel/ **God with us**/ *Matt.1:23; Isa.7:14; Gen.3:15; Rom.16:20*).

 Jesus Christ is the exact image (eikon) of the invisible God. At the Last Supper, Philip said to Jesus, "Lord, show us the Father, and it is enough for us." Their conversation is recorded in John 14:8-21 (word to will to work even greater works).

Before getting into their deep discussion, I want us to see how Jesus dealt with Philip's failure to cycling BASIC bible doctrine by faith when he didn't think it was relevant at the **time of hearing** it. He chose to let it go in **one ear and out the other.**

Before answering Philip, Jesus asked him three question to get him to refocus on faith cycling key BASIC doctrines for personal spiritual growth to have the answers inside (**John 14:9-10, 26**).

3. Note the repetitive word found in 1:15-16______ (ktisis). It is used three times to outline the Theology Thesis.

The first time it was used as the title of this lesson, "Firstborn of All Creation (1:15)."

The second time it was used to explain that "By His Beloved Son All things were **created** (ktizo/aorist p.ind.3ps/punctiliar process can be seen in days of creation) all things (1:16)."

The third time it was used to show four categories of what His Beloved Son created (1:16).

- Heavens and Earth planet Earth Galaxy
- Visible and Invisible vast universe outside Milky Way
- Thrones and Dominions human
- Rulers and Authorities angelic

"All things have been created (ktizo/perf.p.ind.3p/completed process/ passive voice of Creator) through (dia+ablative of agency) Him and for (eis+ accusative) Him."

4. Most of the time we never think of the **pre-existence of Christ** before He became Jesus. But Paul is making this a big point to Colossians.

At the birth of Jesus, an angel of Lord said to **Bethlehem shepherds**, "For today in the city of David there has been **born for you a Savior**, who is Christ the Lord." (Luke 2:11; Matt.1:23)

Prior to today's lesson, you may have not thought of Jesus as greater than creation. Even when you read of Jesus commanding the winds and waters to obey Him (Luke 8:22-25).

5. One thing we have learned today from Paul is that Christ existed apart from creation.

Jesus existed before existence as deity. Deity existed apart from creation (1 Tim.6:13-16).

"Not that anyone has seen the Father, **EXCEPT the One who is from the God; He has seen the Father."** (John 6:46)

"No one has seen God at any time; the Only Begotten God who is in the bosom of the Father, **He** has explained Him." (John 1:18)

I caught **Eccl.3:15** in one of VP Harris' word salads. It didn't make sense because she didn't give credit to the source. "That which is has been already and that which will be has already been, (she omitted) for God seeks what has passed by." (Eccl.3:14-15/ plagiarize)
